

Prym Living Loom – Flower Variation 1



On a bed of flowers

The flower loom enables you to immerse yourself in a sea of flowers all year round. The interchangeable plastic pegs allow you to create any number of variations. You decide on the style – we will show you how to do it! In addition to the flowers, you can also use a simple trick to produce tassels. As diverse as the look of your flowers and tassels, as varied are their areas of use. Decorate cushions, bags, stools, or gloves with individual flowers. Let yourself be inspired and create your own style.

Four-coloured triple flower and tassels

Material:

Cushion cover in brown, bought or home-made; flower loom, article number 624 156; wool needle, article number 124 119; embroidery scissors, article number 611 510; 1 ball of mohair wool in dark brown; 1 ball of cotton each in dark brown, beige and old rose; satin ribbon in old rose, 6 mm wide, article number 982 385.

How to do it:

Flower:

1. Place 12 plastic pegs each into the holes of circles A, C and D. Initially, the top and bottom of the loom sit loosely on top of each other. Insert the yarn end of the mohair wool into the inner hole in position 1 through the top part of the loom and place it onto the bottom part. Click both the top and bottom together. The yarn is now secured and you can start winding your flower.
2. Bring the yarn secured in position 1 on the right around the outer peg to position 7. From there, take it on the left of the row of pegs around the outer peg of position 12. Now on the right around the outer peg of position 6 and on the left to position 11, on the right to position 5, on the left to position 10, on the right to position 4, etc. When the first circle is finished, wind the yarn for another seven rounds before cutting it.
3. Next, wind the satin ribbon for one round in the same manner. Wind the ribbon only around the pegs of circle C. Continue with a further 4 circles using the brown cotton yarn. This is only wound around circle A. Changing the circles from D via C to A allows you to create the different layers of the triple flower and accentuates the colour change.
4. Secure the flower using the cotton yarn in old rose for 2 rounds: use the wool needle to bring approx. 1 m of yarn from underneath up through the centre of all yarn crossovers. In the 1st round, stitch into the flower petals, in the 2nd round, between the petals. Insert the needle from the top in position 1 and then from the bottom to position 7. Now from 12 to 6 and from 11 to 5, etc. When both rounds are stitched, take out the pegs and tie the ends of the yarn together on the back. Done!



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Tassel

How to do it:

1. The tassels can be easily created in different sizes and thicknesses. For large tassels, place 2 pegs in positions D1 and D7. For smaller tassels, select positions A1 and C7. Wind the yarn around both pegs until the tassels have the required thickness. Cut the yarn. Using the needle, bring approx. 20 cm of yarn from underneath through the yarn bundle and tie it securely approx. one-third up the length of the tassel. This will be the tassel head.

2. Again using the needle, take another piece of thread through the tassel head. This can be used either to hang up the tassel or to help you pull through one of your own twisted cords. Now remove the pegs from the top part of the loom and cut open the yarn loops of the long tassel section with the scissors. If you like, you can glue a decorative satin ribbon around the tied part of the tassel head.

Tip:

Naturally, you can also use other types of yarn to create your flower. The general principle is this: the thinner the yarn, the more rounds should be wound. If you like, you can additionally decorate your creations with rhinestones or sequinned tapes. For a particularly beautiful effect, place the flowers on leaves. Simply use self-adhesive iron-on fleece to iron 2 pieces of fabric together, cut out leaves in different sizes and colours, and sew them on by hand under the flower.
