



In full bloom

After close inspection, many an old stool can be transformed into a veritable throne. Choose yarns to match its slipcover and use the flower loom to create an endless variety of flowers that turn this model into an absolute must for the romantic. Those who prefer it somewhat more grand and spectacular can simply opt for a different material composition. We'll show you how to do it, you just choose the style.

Unicoloured triple flower

Material:

Stool with slipcover, bought or home-made; flower loom, article number 624 156; wool needle, article number 124 119; embroidery scissors, article number 611 510; 1 ball of wool in plum, thickness 6.

How to do it:



1. Place 12 plastic pegs each into the holes of circles A, C and D. The top and bottom of the loom sit loosely on top of each other. Insert the yarn end of the wool into the inner hole in position 1 through the top part of the loom and place it onto the bottom part. Click both the top and bottom together. The yarn is now secured.

Bring the yarn on the right around the outer peg to position 7. From there, take it on the left of the row of pegs around the outer peg of position 12. Now on the right around the outer peg of position 6 and on the left to position 11, on the right to position 5, on the left to position 10, on the right to position 4, etc. When the first circle is finished, wind the yarn for another round.



2. In the third round, change to circle C. Changing the circles from D to C allows you to create the different layers of the flower to make it more three-dimensional. The third round is wound in the same manner as described in point 1. Again, wind 2 successive circles.

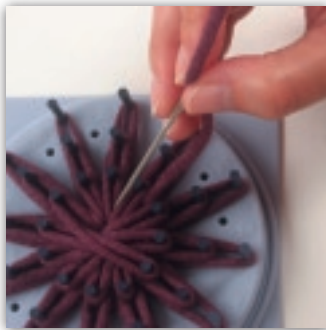

How to do it:



3. Subsequently, change to circle A and work the third layer of the flower. Again, wind the yarn for 2 circles. When done correctly, all the yarn layers will cross in the middle in a star-type layout. A round is finished when each peg is looped.



4. To secure the flower, cut the yarn at a length of approx. 1 m and thread it through the wool needle. Insert the needle from the top through the centre of all yarn crossovers. Stitch between the petals. Insert the needle from the bottom in position 1, then from the top through the centre, from the bottom through position 12, from the top again through the centre, etc. When the round is finished, take out the pegs and tie the ends of the yarn together on the back. Done!

Tip:

Naturally, the flower can have even more layers. The general principle is this: the thinner the yarn, the more rounds should be wound. If you like, you can additionally decorate your creations with rhinestones or sequined tapes. For a particularly beautiful effect, place the flowers on leaves. Simply use self-adhesive iron-on fleece to iron 2 pieces of fabric together, cut out leaves in different sizes and colours, and sew them on by hand under the flower.
